

Welcome to Issue 25 of AGRINFO UPDATE. This issue includes the latest changes to EU maximum residue levels for a number of pesticides and other contaminants. We highlight an opportunity to send feedback to the EU by **8 May** on proposed changes to food safety criteria for *Listeria monocytogenes*. See also the February summary from the European Commission of notifications of non-compliances with EU law, including suspected agrifood fraud and pesticide MRLs exceedances. These reports help public and private sector stakeholders to identify problem areas and take the actions needed to prevent further risk.

New Regulations coming into force and application dates



Pesticide MRLs in Animal Products

EU reduces maximum residue levels for 2,4-DB to 0.05 mg/kg on animal products – applies from **6 November 2024**



Other Pesticide MRLs

EU raises the following maximum residue levels – applies from 6 May 2024

- <u>flonicamid</u> on Chinese cabbages, kales, and kohlrabies
- **isofetamid** on salad plants
- mefentrifluconazole on multiple products
- metazachlor on leeks and honey
- pyrimethanil on table grapes, garlic, and honey





Contaminants

EU reduces maximum levels of:

- <u>deoxynivalenol</u> in cereals/cereal-based foods from 1 July 2024
- <u>3-MCPD</u> in infant formula from 1 January 2025

EU establishes maximum levels for:

• T-2 and HT-2 toxins in cereal-based foods – from 1 July 2024



Novel foods

EU authorises several novel foods – from 30 April 2024

EU changes specifications for:

- <u>astaxanthin-rich oleoresin</u> from Haematococcus pluvialis algae from 29 April 2024
- galacto-oligosaccharide (no longer requires minimum galactose level) from 28 April 2024
